


# MBTA Communities Act Referendum Voter Analysis

# History

- At a special Milton town meeting on December 11th, 2023 town meeting members voted to adopt a zoning article with the most comprehensive zoning changes in nearly 100 years.
- Subsequently a successful and historic signature drive collecting nearly 3,000 signatures forced a town wide referendum to allow all the voters in Milton an opportunity to help decide on this zoning article.
- On February 14th, 2024 the residents of Milton voted overwhelmingly by 54% to reject the zoning article.

# Analysis

- TMM and Voters differed by 22% overall (32% to 54%).
- A greater percentage of voters voted NO in all precincts except for one when compared with TMM votes.
- The greatest difference was in P6 with a difference of 35 percentage points between Voters (68%) and TMM (33%).
- Nearly 9500 votes cast, the most in a local election in over five years
